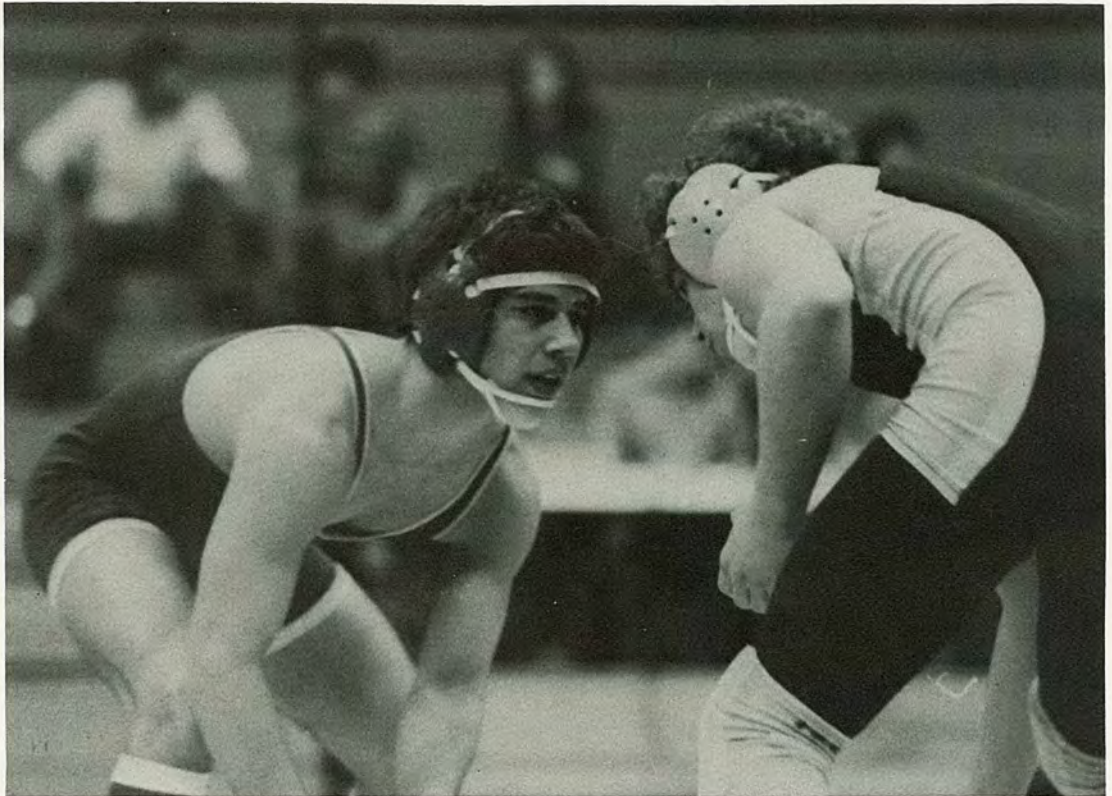


Changes in St. Edward were also detectable throughout the school year. The school became a year older physically, but at the same time, it became stronger with the memories that were being continually painted in our minds.

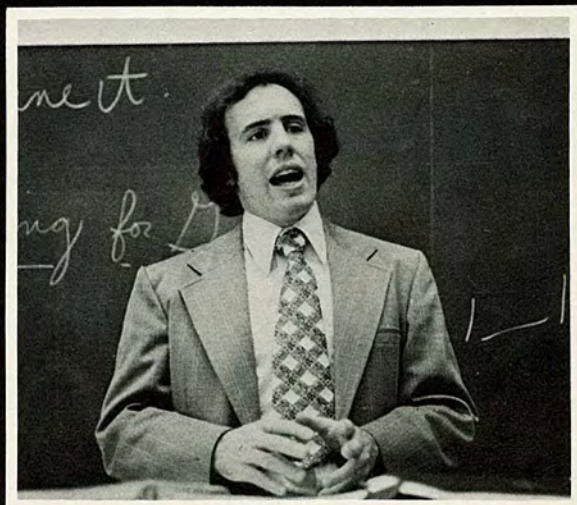

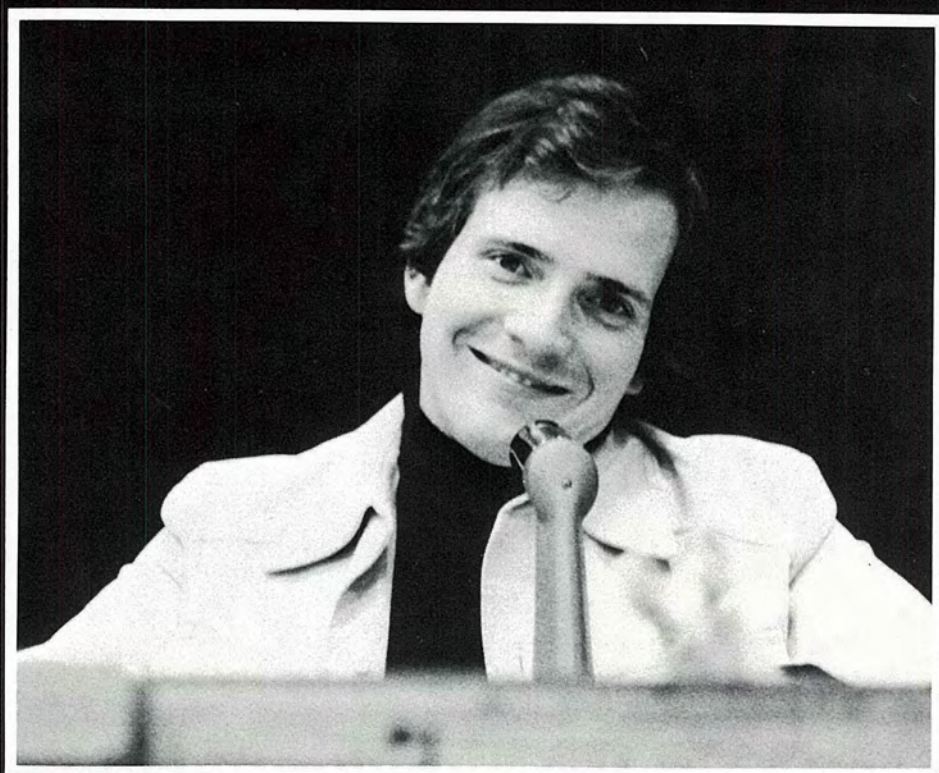

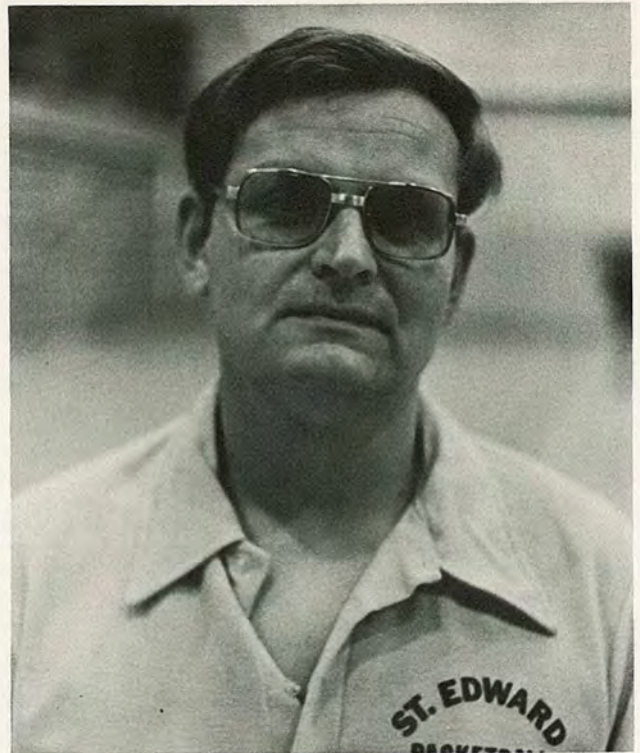




It seems each new year

Dance Committee



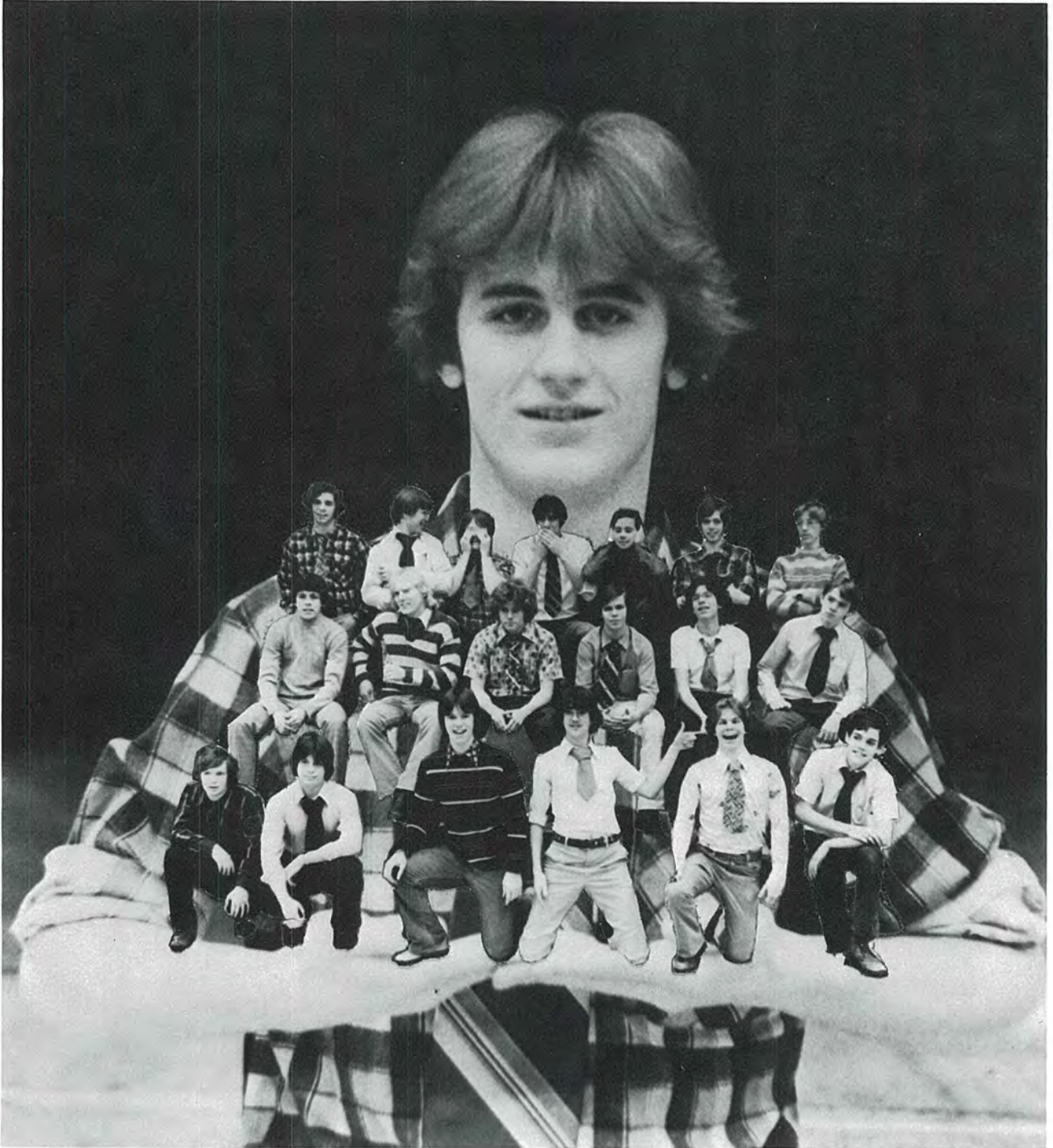

Edsman keeps the students informed

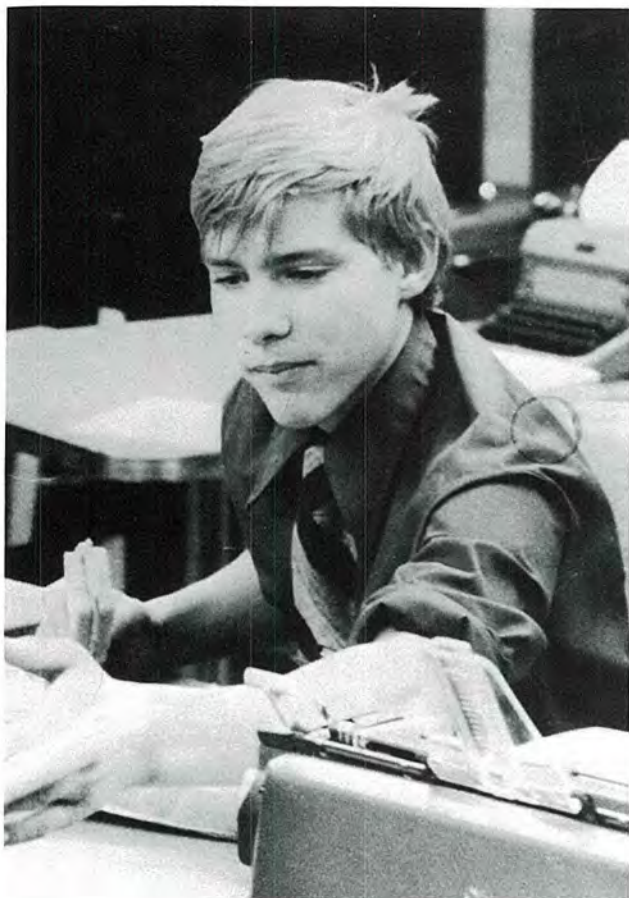

Junior Council on World Affairs



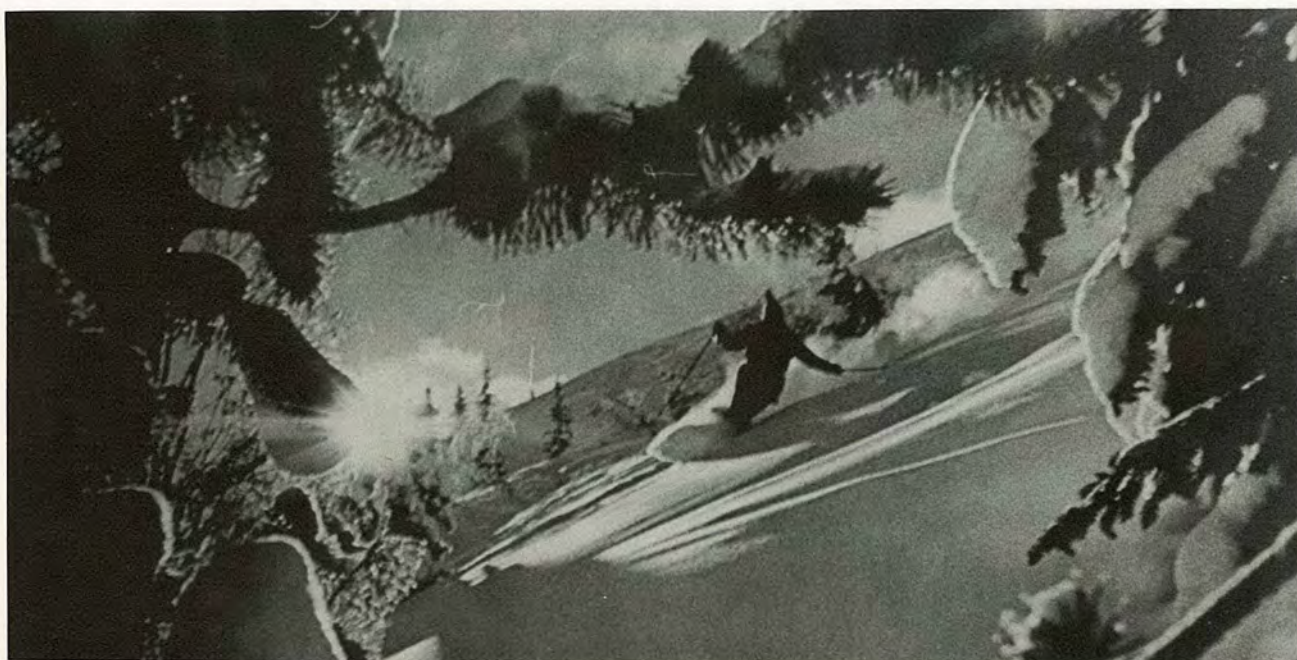
The Junior Council on World Affairs attempts to bring global issues closer to the student. By representing actual countries, delegates throw off the habit of looking at the world through the United States' point of view.

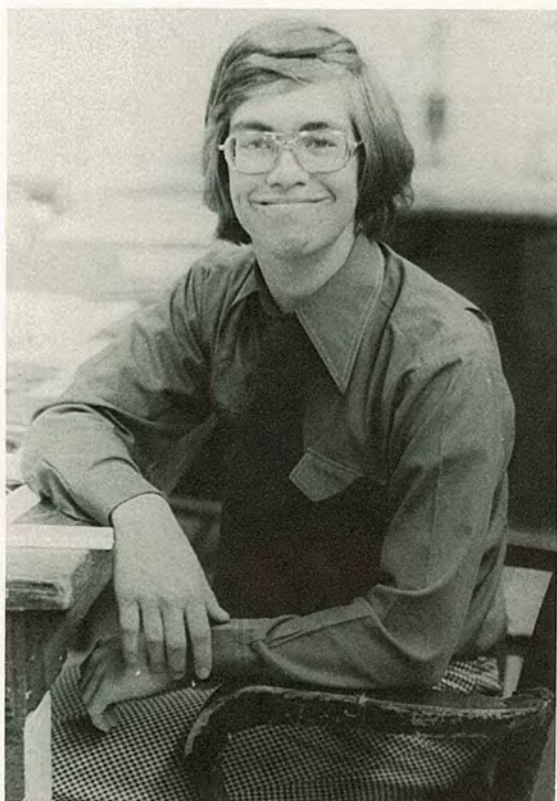

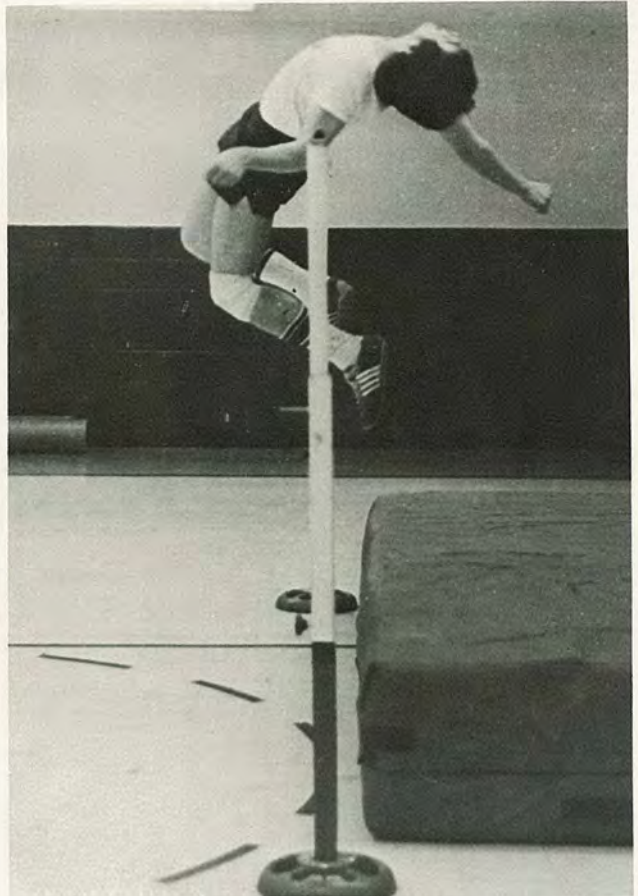

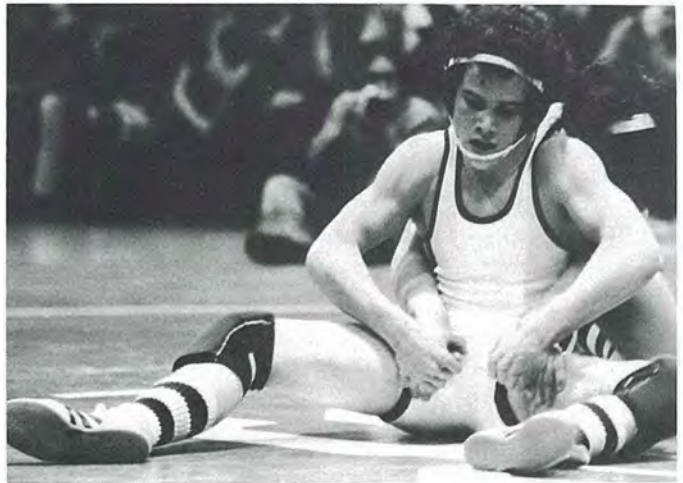
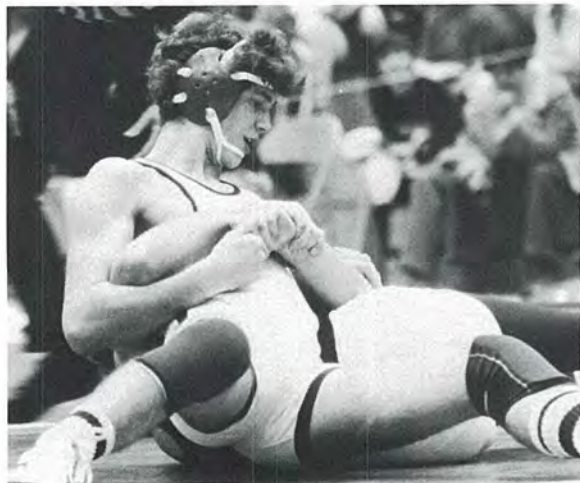
This year the Varsity Wrestling Team accomplished what fourth year coach Howard Ferguson had predicted when he arrived at St. Edward — a State Championship Title.

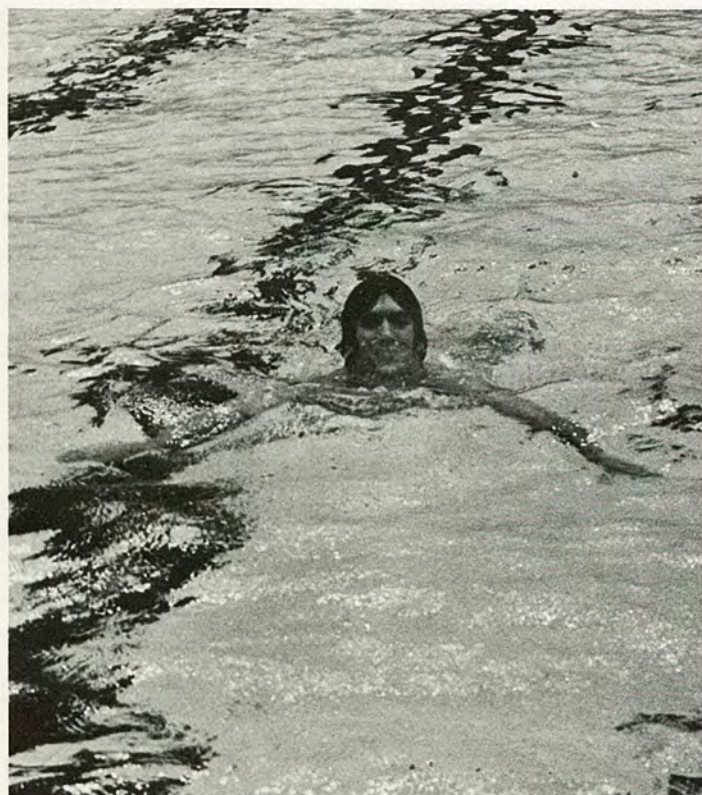
Splashing through the 1977-78 season, the Varsity Swimming Team has met some very well-coordinated and skillful opponents.

Padua was up for their Homecoming game as they held the Eagle rushers to only 55 yards and handed us our first loss of the season, outscoring the Eagles 15-6.

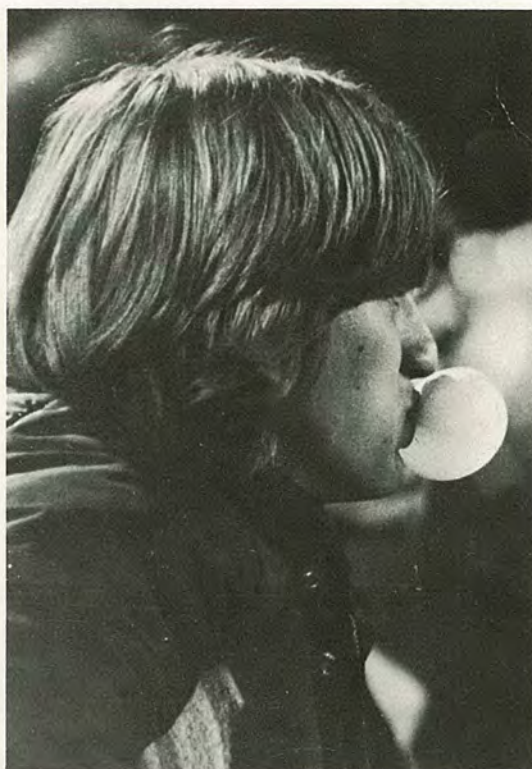
A case hardened defense held Latin to only six points. We went on to win the important Crown Conference game 20-6.

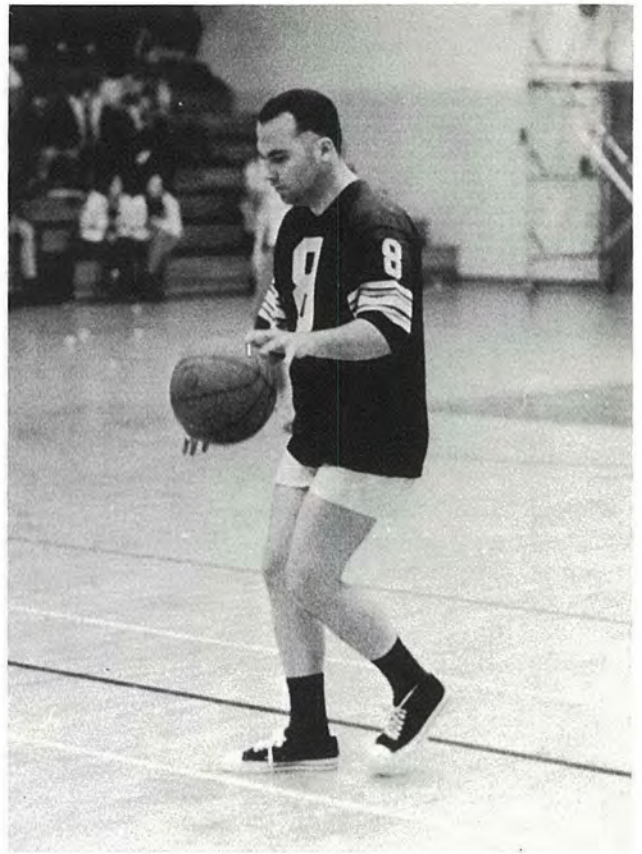


Mark Hughes, Mike Giuliano, Jeff Daniels, and John Skelly, the 1978 880 yd. Relay Team.

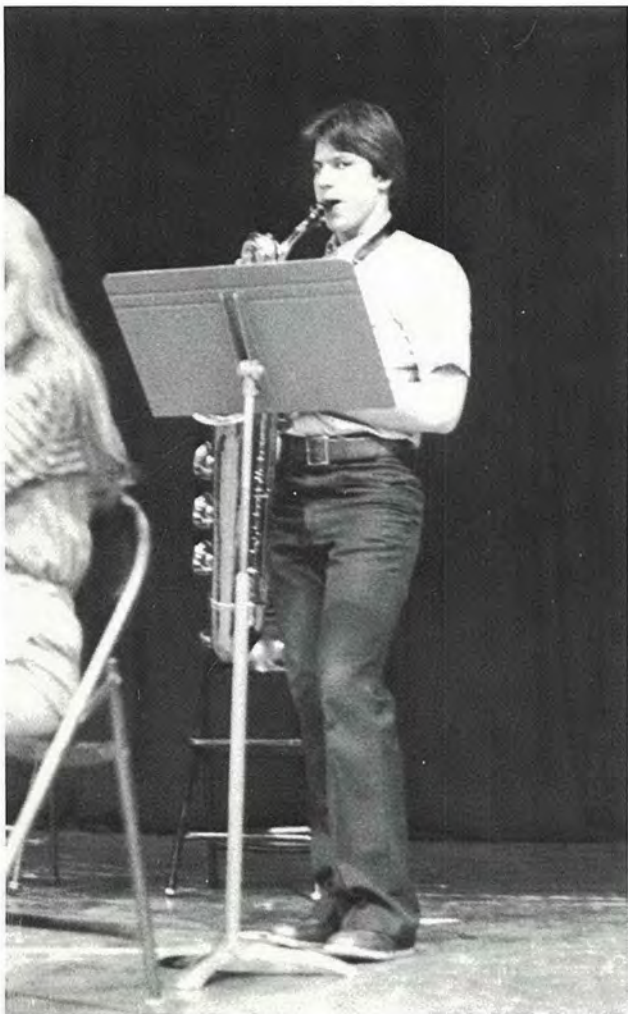

Bingo Bacso displays his ball handling ability.

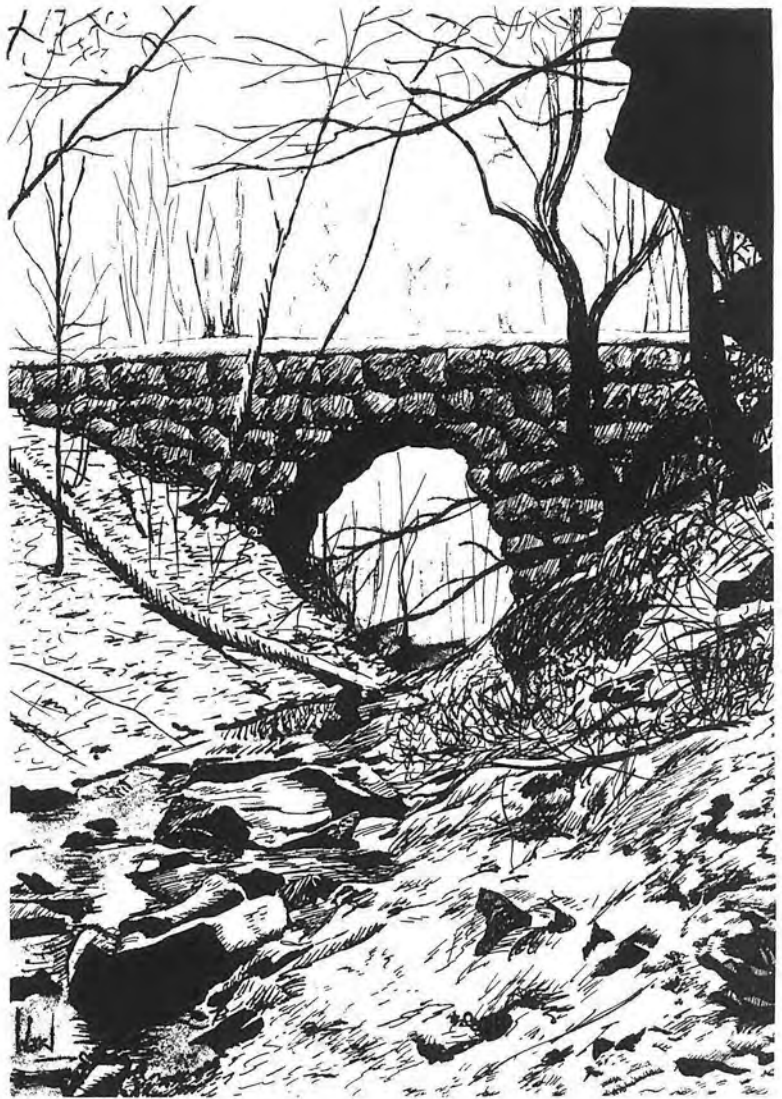

The cover lettering style is Mikewardian.

It contains 1,776 photos, 1,118 of which were taken by Ohio School Pictures, and 281 of which were taken by Higbee's Photo Studio.
