
Changes in St. Edward were also detectable throughout the school year. The school became a year older physically, but at the same time, it became stronger with the memories that were being continually painted in our minds.






It seems each new year brings changes . . .

# Dance Committee







#### Edsman keeps the students informed




#### Marching Band keeps up spirit




#### Concert Band & Brass Choir



Hard work and preparation are capped off by Model United Nations Assemblies throughout the country and even at the U.N. Building in New York City.















#### Rallies promote school spirit



Although "Godspell" has left the St. Edward stage, its spirit still remains.






### Icers finish season 13-6-1


This year the Varsity Wrestling Team accomplished what fourth year coach Howard Ferguson had predicted when he arrived at St. Edward — a State Championship Title.



Splashing through the 1977-78 season, the Varsity Swimming Team has meet some very well-coordinated and skillful opponents.



#### Green Machine finishes 7-2 season



A case hardened defense held Latin to only six points. We went on to win the important Crown Conference game 20-6.









Mark Hughes, Mike Giuliano, Jeff Daniels, and John Skelly, the 1978 880 yd. Relay Team.





It contains 1,776 photos, 1,118 of which were taken by Ohio School Pictures, and 281 of which were taken by Higbee's Photo Studio.
