## DEDICATION

One quiet day in the late summer of 1955, Brother Barry stepped from a car and let his eyes wander over the building and grounds of St. Edward High School. It is impossible to say what his sentiments were that day, but now, after six years of a successful administration, we may surmise that with humility of spirit and prayerful heart he generously accepted the responsibilities placed upon him by his superiors.

Indeed, our new Principal had been preceded by other highly-trained men dedicated to the cause of Catholic education, men who had supervised the construction and organization of St. Edward, had seen it accredited as a first class high school by the State of Ohio, and had watched with joy as three classes were graduated from the new school. But secondary education is far from static, and it continually demands of administrators that they face and solve new problems.

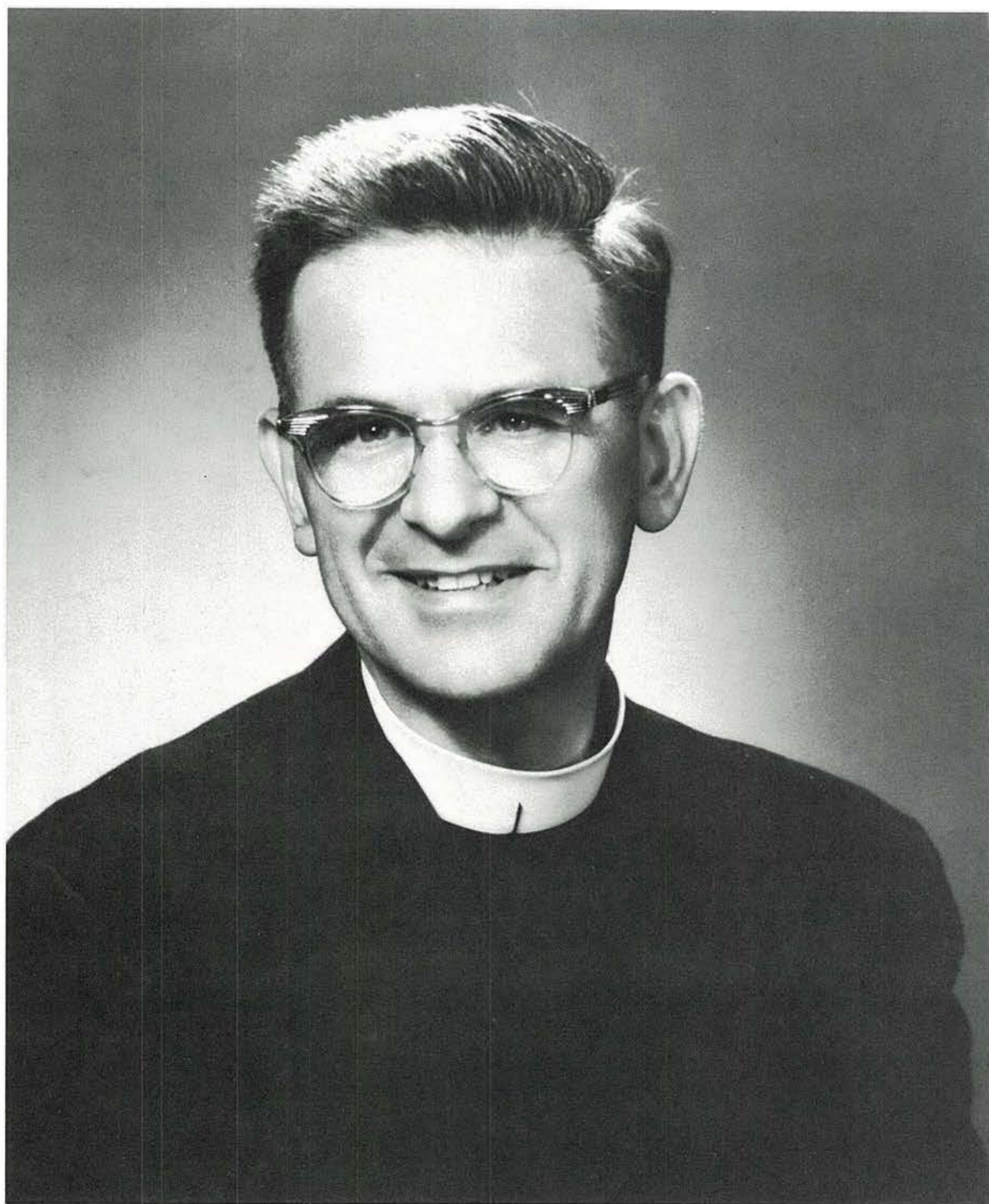
In Brother Barry's first year as Principal, he watched with great satisfaction the students participating in the most successful football season the school has ever enjoyed. This was an excellent beginning, but the energy of Brother Barry was being focused on other matters as well: the reorganization of traditional curricula, the strengthening of departments of instruction, the raising of academic standards, and the outlining of duties of department heads, to mention but a few. From the very outset, faculty and students alike saw in their new Principal the determination to make St. Edward one of the finest educational institutions in the area.

Every year of his administration major improvements were made. Among these were; the introduction of IBM to minimize the clerical work of the teachers in reporting grades; the more efficient use of standardized tests in guiding students in choice of courses and preparation for their post-high school careers; the establishment of a very active chapter of the National Honor Society to encourage student scholarship, leadership, character and service; and the development of better parent-teacher contacts.

In a school the size of St. Edward, it would seem impossible that a principal could exercise a personal interest in the welfare of individual students. But it can be truly said that Brother Barry has at all times maintained this paternal concern for all students under his care.

True progress has taken place at St. Edward over the past six years. May we, the faculty and students, assure Brother Barry that what he has done for us is his greatest memorial. At the completion of his term of office, we feel that our Principal experiences the rich meaning of St. Augustine's words: "There is something in humility which strangely exalts the heart."



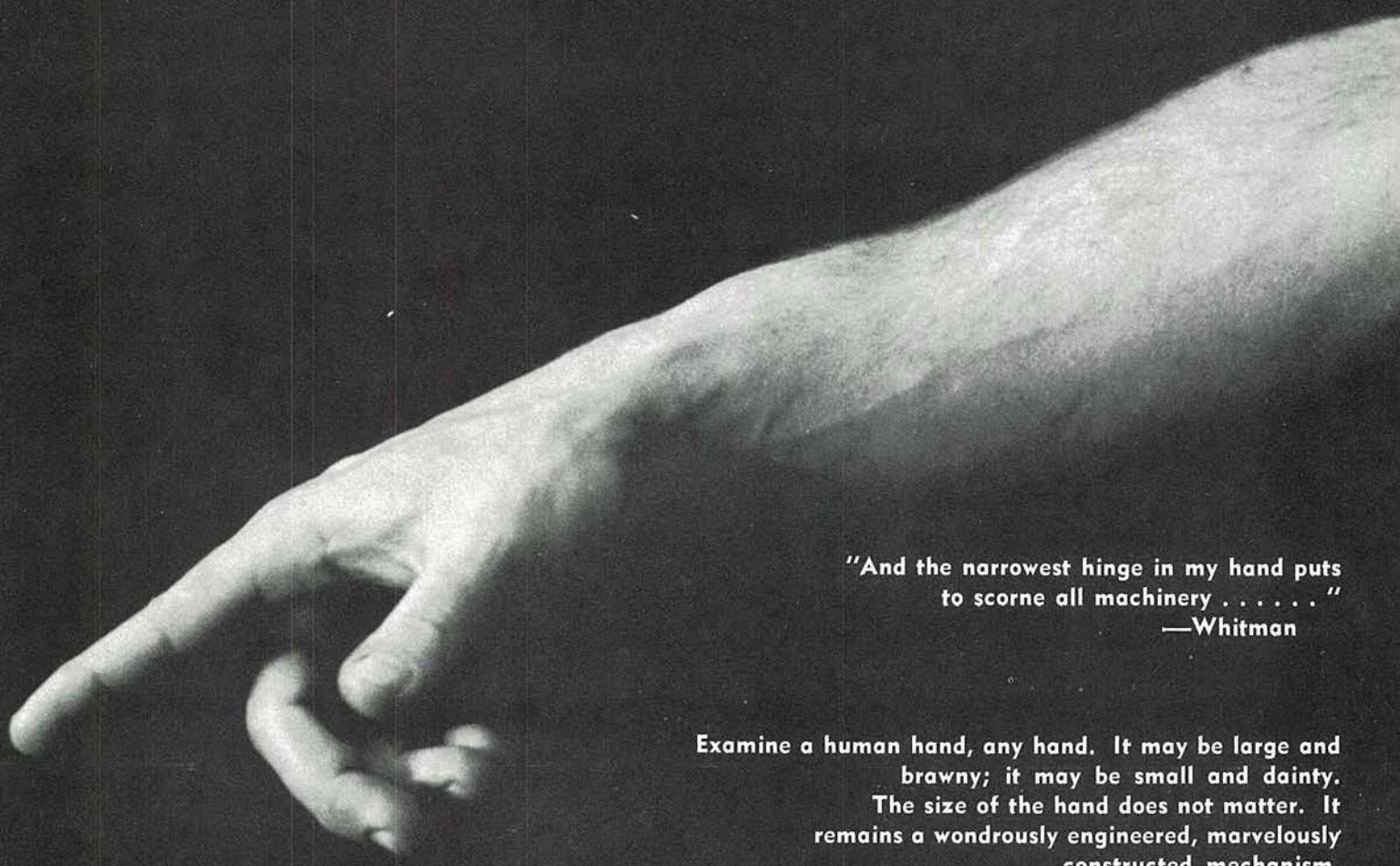

citement of a last minute pin by wrestlers Ron Dachtler or Steve Surovey.

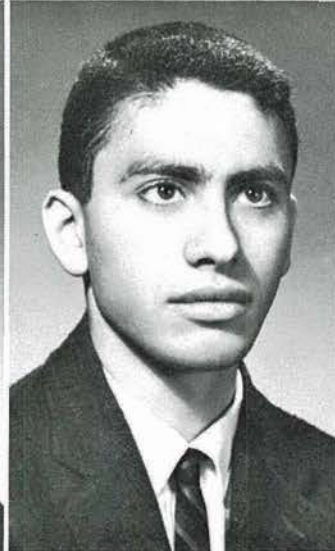

# THE NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY



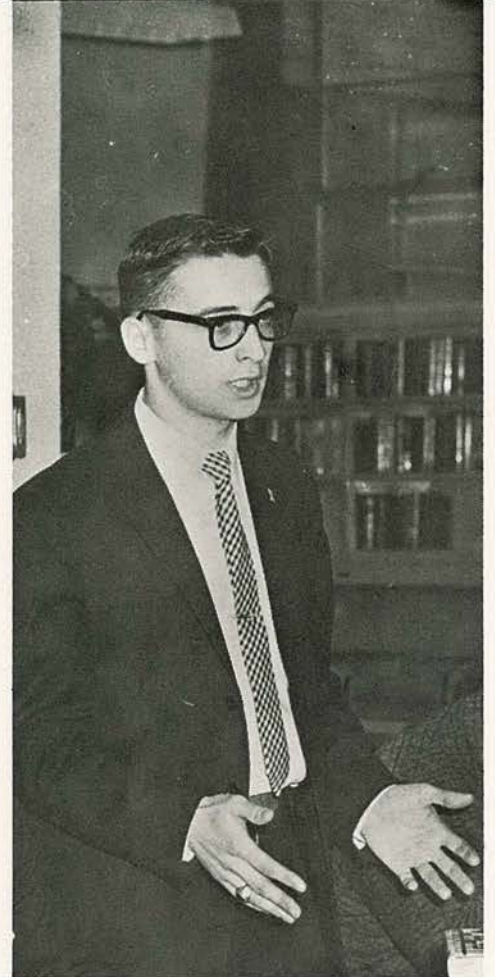
Founded in 1921 by the National Association of Secondary-School Principals, the National Honor Society has been established in over ten thousand of the best high schools in America. Saint Edward is proud to have been approved by this organization and to have been granted Charter No. 7440 in 1958.

The object of the National Honor Society is to create an enthusiasm for high scholarship; to stimulate a desire to render purposeful service to Church, school, and community; to promote constructive leadership; and to encourage the development of a worthy Christian character. These noble qualities of scholarship, service, leadership and character have always been the hallmark of the Saint Edward Man.

Membership in the society is limited to five per cent of the Sophomore Class, to ten per cent of the Junior Class, and to fifteen per cent of the Senior Class. Students are selected by the Principal and members of the Faculty on the basis of the four qualities mentioned above.

A candidate must have a 2.5 average in school, and a member must maintain this average to stay in the society. Personality profile sheets on each candidate are carefully studied by the faculty council, and an exemplary disciplinary record is likewise required. Prospective and actual members of the society must participate in at least one major and one minor extracurricular activity, or two major activities. A freshman student must be active in at least one major extracurricular to be eligible for probationary membership as a sophomore.

Local chapter meetings are held bi-weekly in the school library, and the officers and members conduct the business according to parliamentary procedure. Within the St. Edward chapter at the present time there are five different groups: a Patriotic Committee; a Publicity and Speakers' Bureau; an Activities Committee; a Lab-Assistants' Committee; and a Tutoring Committee. These groups sponsor and execute the various works of the National Honor Society here at Saint Edward High School.

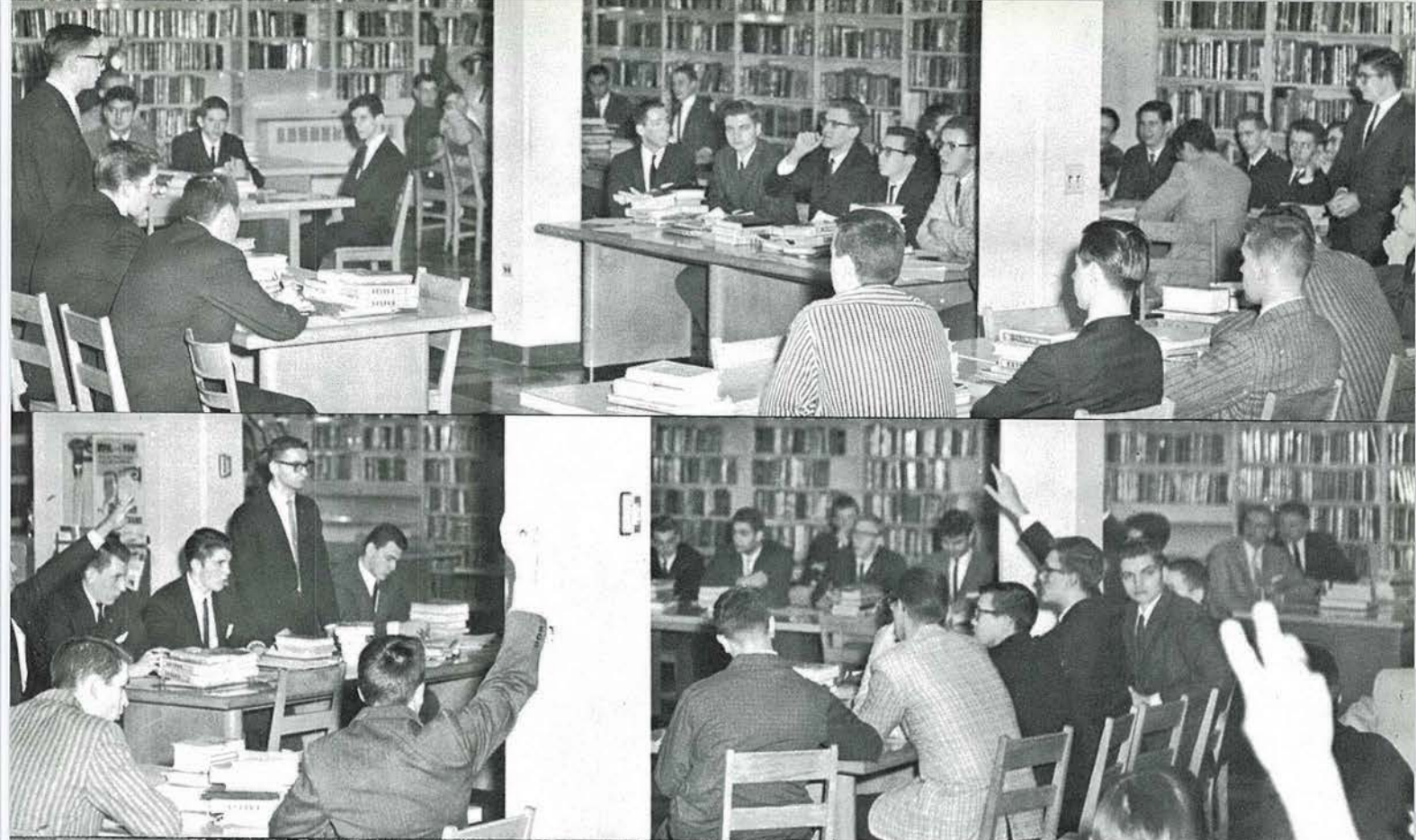

The 1960-1961 St. Edward High School Band has proved to be one of the best in the musical history of St. Ed's.

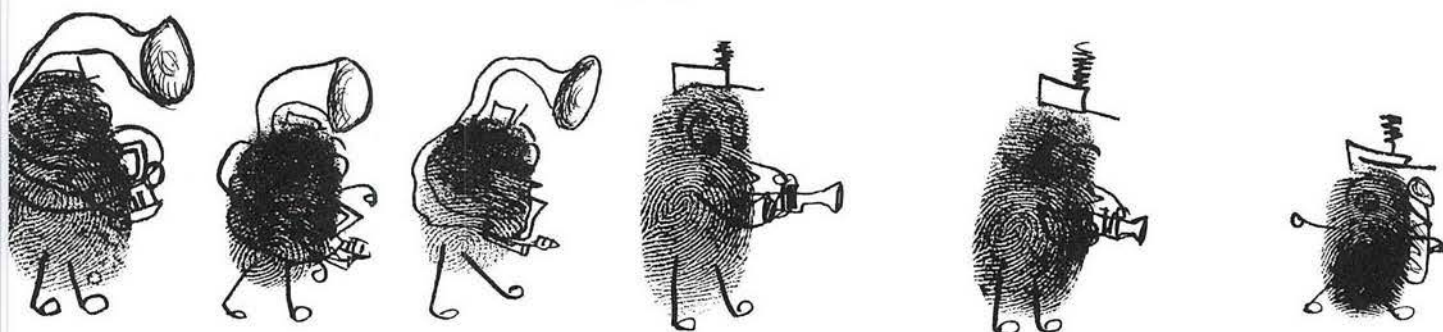
Along with its fine display of precision marching during the football season, the band also offered numerous half-time shows which proved to be entertaining and many times humorous.

As the band moved indoors after the football season and prepared for its first formal concert at Christmas, its members concentrated on maintaining the euphonic excellence for which the band is noted.

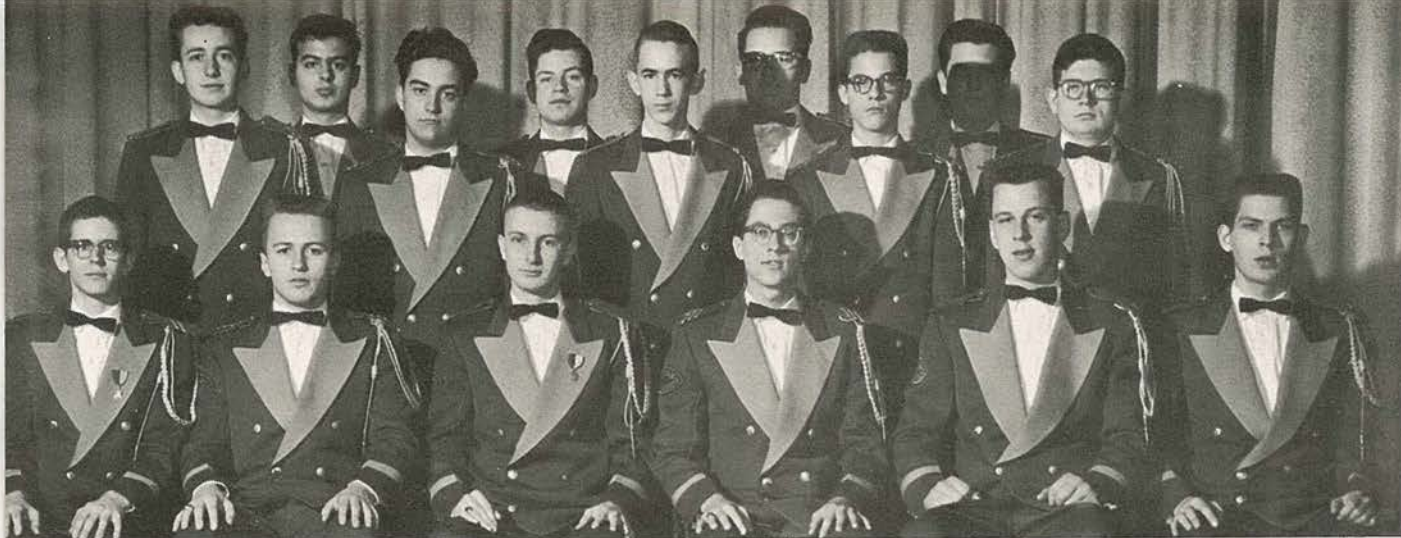

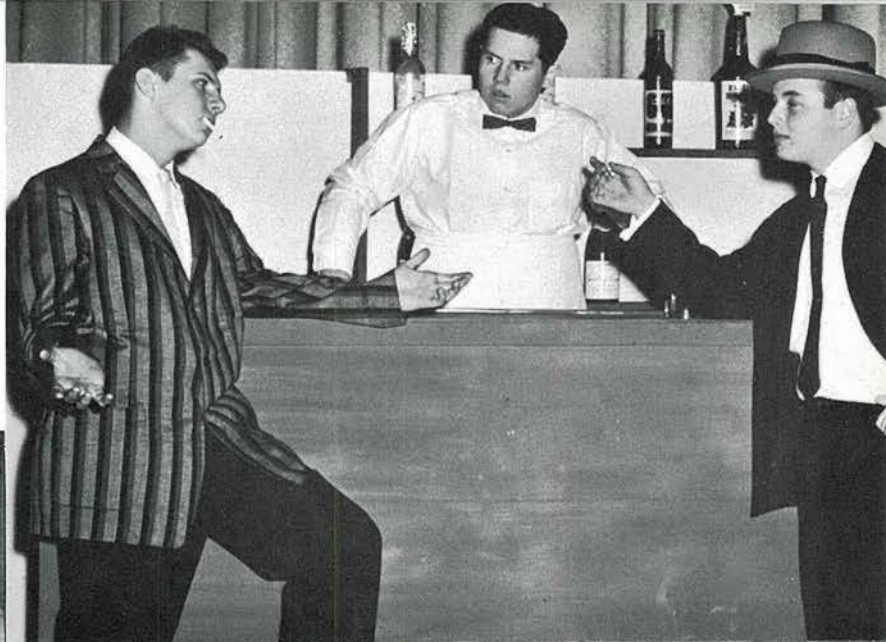

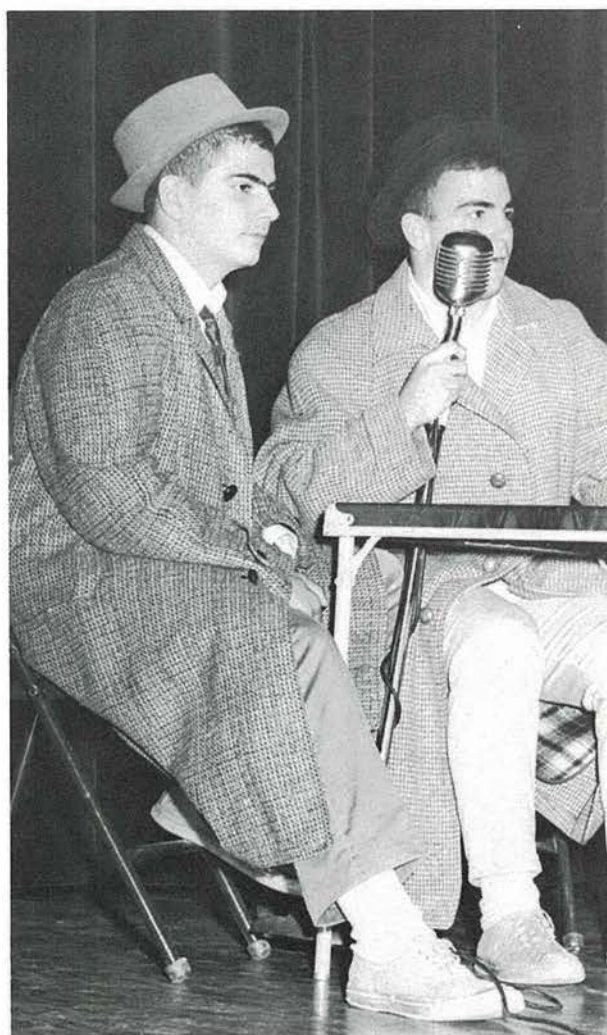
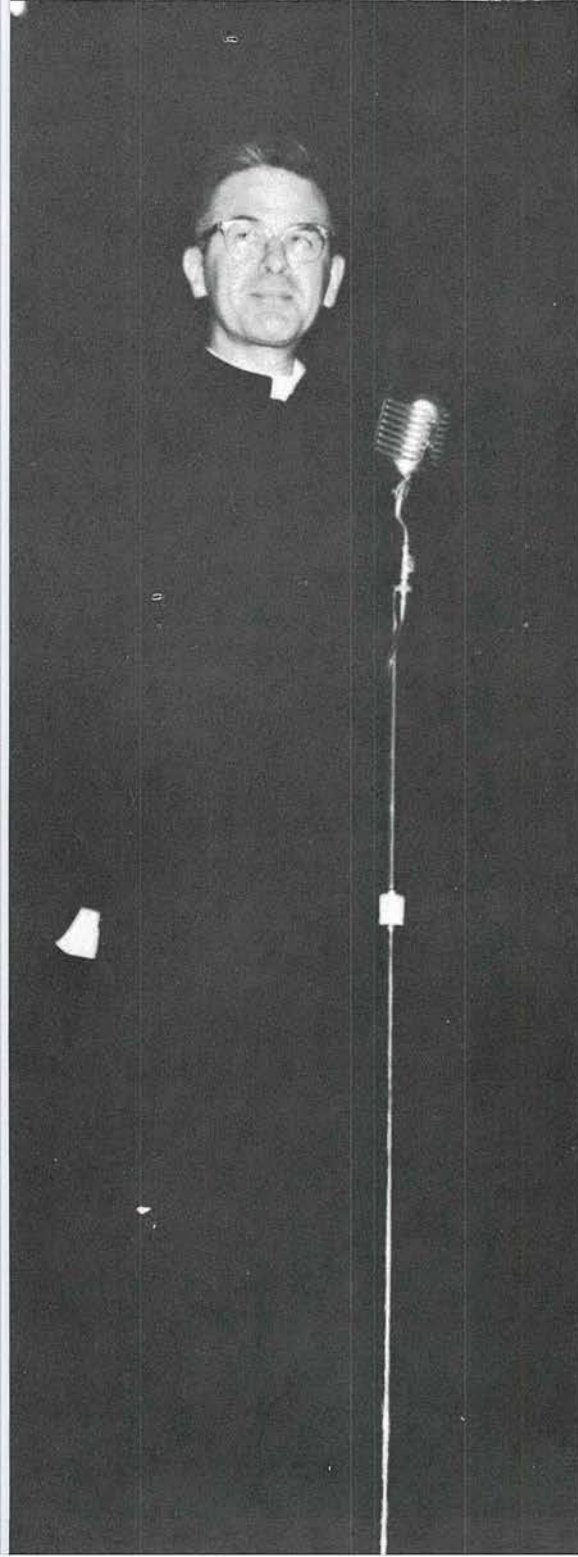






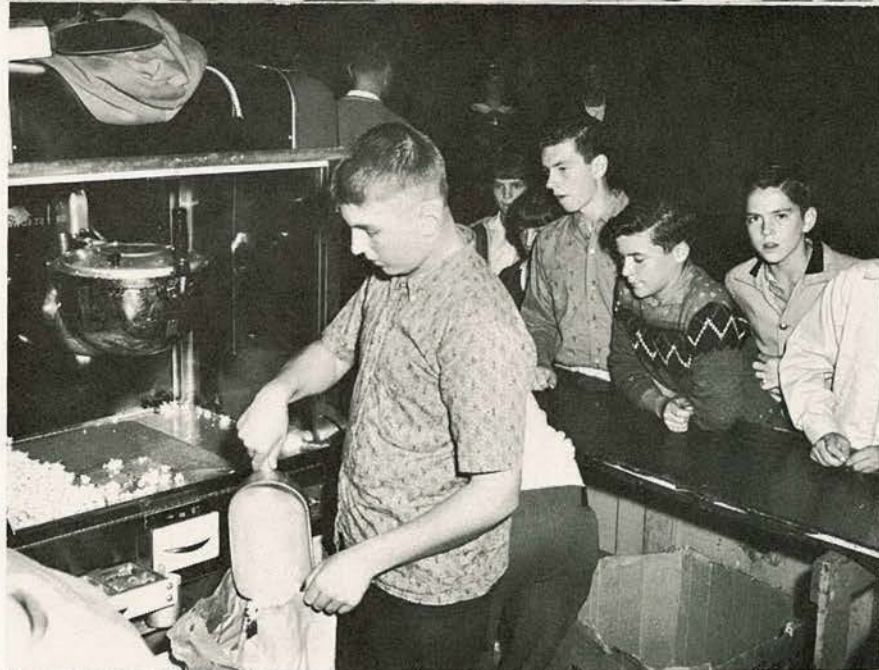
You're on special schedule. The periods have been completely reversed. You have your morning class in the afternoon and afternoon classes in the morning with lunch one and one half periods later than usual.
